[Inside Sweden's Most Expensive House, a Hot Piece of Glass](#)

At 55M Swedish krona—roughly **\$8.125M** by today's conversion rates—this five-bedroom house is the most expensive in the country. The 4,500-square-foot modern—which would do well as the setting of a James Bond movie—has a wine cellar, an open floorplan, and glass walls for days. Of course, it's [not the only](#) sleek, minimalist creation in Mother Svea, as it's jokingly referred to, but this place, which [looms high](#) over the Southern town of Helsingborg, has views of red-tiled roofs (and the ocean, of course) from its many balconies and terraces.
