Did these buyers and sellers get their money's worth?

1986

German-born chef and cookbook author Anna Pump, founder of the food purveyor and catering company Loaves & Fishes and the Bridgehampton Inn, buys this

2,700-square-foot four-bedroom house near Otter Pond on Sag Harbor's Main Street, once known as Captains Row for the whaling ship captains who resided in grand homes along the thoroughfare. She and her husband, Detlef, spend



\$163,000 (the equivalent of \$373,872 in 2018) on the circa-1840 structure.

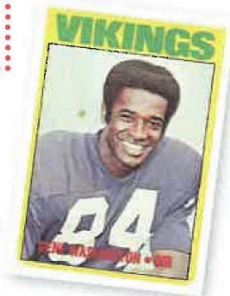


1994

The Pumps sell the home to composer Marvin Hamlisch for **\$465,000** (\$788,333 in 2018).

1998

Football commentator Gene Washington, a former wide receiver for the Minnesota Vikings and the Denver Broncos, pays **\$515,000** (\$792,357 in 2018) for the property.



2013

Douglas Elliman Real Estate broker Noble Black and his husband, lawyer Marc Rozic, buy the home for **\$1.75 million** (\$1.876 million in 2018) and hire

decorator John Bjørnen to renovate it, keeping intact the six fireplaces and wide-plank wood floors. Landscape designer Joseph Cornetta revamps the grounds and adds a plunge pool.

2018

In April, the couple list the house for **\$3.1 million** with fellow Douglas Elliman brokers Jonathan Davis and John Giruzzi. —Lisa Chamoff
